At Oreston we follow **Read Write Inc. Phonics**, a very popular and successful reading programme. All staff are highly skilled in teaching this programme and have weekly coaching and practice sessions.

The programme ensures that children 'keep up, not catch up'. Your child will be assessed before the end of this term and be grouped based on their phonic ability for their return in September. Your child will then be assessed at the end of each half term throughout the year so that they are always in the right group to maximise their reading progress.

- Star Assessment works out what level your child should be reading at, this range is called the Zone of Proximal Development (ZPD).
 - Choose a book at their own level.
- Take a short online quiz to measure their understanding.
 - Monitor children's reading practice.

Home Connect

You can have access to the Home Connect portal to receive updates on your child's successes when they take a quiz. Log in details to follow in September.











Your child's reading (at home) will be recorded in the Home Learning Planner.

- Expectation is a minimum of 3 home reads.
- Checked by staff weekly and number of reads counted (1 read=1 point).

In September, we are introducing our **Learning Planners**, which every child will receive. The intention is to promote the high value we put on home/school links and continuing school learning at home.

Home learning is to be recorded in them each week and planners then shared with the class teacher.

These are to be valued and looked after by children. Replacements will need to be purchased should your child lose or damage them.





Home Learning

Your child will be issued home learning through Class Dojo. Home Learning will be set on a **Friday** and will be due in the following **Thursday**. This will include:

- A Maths task linked to KIRF's
- An English Task this could be handwriting, reading phonics flashcards or practising spellings

We encourage daily reading but at least three times a week.

Please use the weekly planner pages to record home learning completed.



Daily Routines



Arrival time is between 8.40 – 8:50am. Children should be in the classroom by 8:50am ready to put belongings away and start morning activity.

Break time is 11-11:15am Lunchtime is 12:15-1:15pm

At the end of the day, the children will leave via the playground (next to the studio).

Please only come forward when your child is at the front of the line to assist us in making collection quicker and easier.





All children are expected to wear school uniform. It consists of the following items:



- Oreston logo navy blue sweatshirt or cardigan (no zips or hoods)

- Oreston (or plain) white polo shirt / collared shirt / blouse
- Grey or navy skirt, pinafore dress, tailored trousers or shorts

 - Suitable black school shoes (no trainers or boots)
 - Note: Children in Foundation, Year 1 and 2 must have a school book-bag. All items of clothing must be clearly marked with your child's name.
