





At Oreston we follow Read Write Inc. Phonics, a very popular and successful reading programme. All staff are highly skilled in teaching this programme and have weekly coaching and practice sessions.

The programme ensures that children 'keep up, not catch up'. Your child will be assessed before the end of this term and be grouped based on their phonic ability for their return in September. Your child will then be assessed at the end of each half term throughout the year so that they are always in the right group to maximise their reading progress.

- Star Assessment works out what level your child should be reading at, this range is called the Zone of Proximal Development (ZPD).
 - Choose a book at their own level.
 - Take a short online quiz to measure their understanding.
 - Monitor children's reading practice.

Daily Routines

Children can come to school wearing their PE kit on their PE days.






What to bring each day
