Oreston Community Academy – Home Learning

At Oreston Community Academy we believe home learning is 'an essential part good education that supports children's development as independent learners'. We believe that home learning is one of the main ways in which children can acquire the skill of independent learning. We value the effectiveness of home learning when used to practise and apply concepts previously learnt in school.

Reading: This is an essential life skill and we believe this opens up the world of learning. In order for your child to succeed, we request all children read daily or hear someone read to them so they are practising their fluency and comprehension.

Reading in Foundation and Key Stage One: Reading on a regular basis is vital. Children will bring their reading books home every evening, and the role of the adult is to listen and support them. It is important to remind them to use different strategies to read new words i.e, using their phonics knowledge and 'Fred Talk' to sound words out, looking at the pictures and looking for words within words; these are ways in which the child can read an unknown word. Just as important is discussing the book to check that the child has understood what they have read. Children will have a reading log which parents/carers should sign or comment in each time they read.

Reading in Key Stage Two: Children may read to an adult, with an adult or read to themselves, in the presence of an adult. The story and characters should be talked about and new words discussed. Older children need a clear understanding of the text, which sometimes will go beyond the literal meaning. Children will read texts that are more detailed and will take longer to read. They should be encouraged to read all types of texts including non-fiction. Parents should check their child's reading log to show that they have read to an adult or had a discussion about the book.

Spellings and Phonics: Children are provided with a set of spellings which are taught and practised within the school day. To make the best possible progress, children are required to continue learning these words at home so they can transfer this knowledge into their writing. Phonics will be based around what the children will be learning in class.

Other Home Learning: Other home learning links to the children's class theme with creative tasks designed to develop and enhance all styles of learning. The children are encouraged to take ownership of this learning. Children will have a choice of 3 activities to choose from every 3 weeks. This is to provide children with a choice of task to encourage motivation and a love of learning. The children will have 3 weeks to complete these in a style they wish to show their creativity and passion for a subject.

Family Homework: Each half term, children will be set the same piece of home learning. This home learning is open ended and allows families and siblings to work on a project or complete an activity together such as autumn walks, attend an event etc. This will provide opportunities for you to enjoy family time together while sharing in your child's learning.
