In Jigsaw, the children will be looking at 'Dreams and Goals.' They will learn how to achieve goals they set and develop their understanding the emotions that go with this. In term 4, the children will start to look at 'Healthy Me' with a focus on how to keep themselves safe and healthy.

In PE, the children will begin to use the skills that have learnt to start, stop and move in different directions. They will have a go at balancing in different shapes, bounce and pass a ball in a small game situation.
